Muddy and wet seem like the most fitting words to describe our winter so far. While it has been challenging at times, we are blessed to have the moisture and look forward to favorable grass growing conditions this spring. The herd has handled the less than ideal conditions well and we are happy to still be grazing a large portion of the herd on stockpiled fescue with some hay supplementation. We continue to become bigger and bigger believers in stockpiled fescue. The cows and calves perform excellent on it. We had a busy fall and winter with embryo and A.I. breeding projects with about 215 females being bred. Initial ultrasound pregnancy checks have been completed to determine if the cows settled to the A.I. or Embryo. We try to do this around 60 days post breeding to insure accurate pregnancy status. We currently have an awesome group of bred heifers and two select herd sire prospects for sale in our 'On Target 5A' online sale which will be held March 11 on https://l365auctions.com/auction/4583.
